Summer: Let's go to China!

Understand geographical similarities and differences through studying the human and physical geography of a small area of the United Kingdom, and a small area in a contrasting non-European country (in the context of China). To use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the countries studied at this key stage (in the context of China).

Autumn: Seaside location

Using Google Earth to locate different seaside locations, compare the weather, using maps and globes, begin to identify the seven continents and the seven oceans.

Name and research the continents, plot a journey around the world including compass directions,
