ENGLISH

Reading for meaning, enjoyment & understanding
Gain confidence with skimming & scanning skills to locate information quickly
Discuss a text, giving & justifying opinions.
Use their growing knowledge of root words, prefixes and suffixes to read aloud and understand the meaning of new words.
Develop a positive attitude to reading by increasing their familiarity with a wide range of books.
Find and discuss words and phrases that capture their interest.

Spell words from the year 3 vocabulary list, use prefixes and suffixes to change the tense or meaning of words.
Write from memory some simple dictated sentences including the correct punctuation.
Use a range of punctuation with increasing confidence in their writing (commas, exclamation marks, question marks, inverted commas).
To use 'a' and 'an' accurately in their work.
To use high quality adjectives as well as the conjunctions and, but, because and so to help add detail to their writing.
To write using the correct tense.
To gain confidence in carrying out their own research using non fiction books and e-based books.
Identify features of non-fiction, fiction (narrative) and letter texts.
To complete extended writing tasks that apply their learning and show links with their topic based work (a letter, fact file, a kenning poem and an adventure story.

HISTORY

SCIENCE

Rocks and Soils
Learn about the three types of rock (metamorphic, igneous and sedimentary) and how they were formed. Classify rocks accord to their properties and discuss how these are used in building and daily living.
Learn about how fossils form and make our own.
