#### Numbers to 20

Dev subitising and counting skills and composition of numbers within and beyond 5. To identify when two sets are equal or unequal and connect two equal groups to doubles. To connect quantities to numerals. To begin to identify missing parts for numbers within 5

To explore the structure of the numbers 6 and 7 as '5 and a bit' and connect this to finger patterns and the Hungarian number frame

To focus on equal and unequal groups when comparing numbers

To understand that two equal groups can be called a 'double' and connect this to finger patterns

To sort odd and even numbers according to their 'shape'

To continue to develop their understanding of the counting sequence and link cardinality and ordinality

To order numbers and play track games

To join in with verbal counts beyond 20, hearing the repeated pattern within the counting numbers
